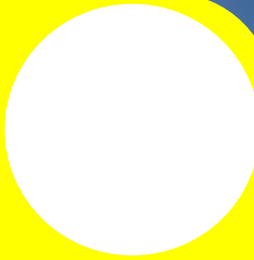

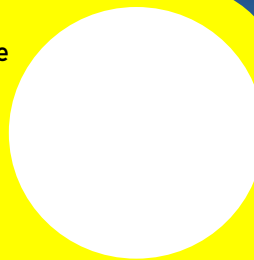

Clue 1: In the side yard find the space where flowers bloom.



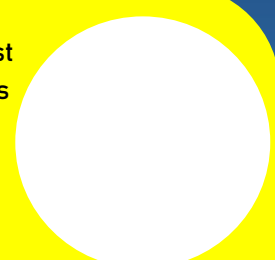

Clue 3: Check around the place of the birds' feeding frenzy. (please be gentle when handling this container)



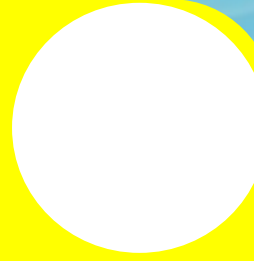

Clue 5: Find the first post near where the ground is filled with rocks.



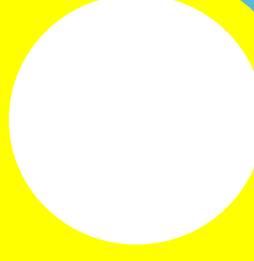

Clue 2: Search along the barrier between the neat and tidy yard and the wilds of nature.



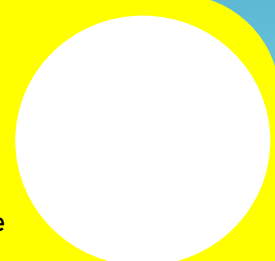
